

CLASSROOM LANGUAGE.-

The beginning of the lesson

Good morning / afternoon / evening.

Good morning / afternoon / evening everyone.

Hi, everybody.

Be quiet / Quite down, please!

Can I have your attention, please?

Could you all listen to me, please?

Listen to me, please.

Luis, are you with us?

Silence, please.

Would you pay attention, please?

Simple commands = órdenes sencillas.

Can you plug the data projector for me, please? The wall plug / socket is behind.

Come out to the smart board / blackboard and

Come in.

Put your hands up / down.

Go out.

Look at activity five.

Isabel, please, come to the front of the class.

Open your handouts at page six.

Turn to page eleven.

Let's settle down and get started = Pongámonos cómodos y comencemos.

Sit down, please.

Stand up, please.

Switch on / off the lights / computers / air-conditioning.

Can you close the blinds, please?

Can you open the windows, please?

**Eliciting / reviewing information and previous knowledge=
Comprobando información y conocimientos previos.**

Could you tell me what you remember from our last lesson?

Does anyone remember

Who can remember what we were talking about at the end of last lesson?

Who can tell me

Who would like to get extra *marks/credit today*?

**Setting up an activity / Giving instructions for an activity =
Dando instrucciones para una actividad.**

Work in pairs / Work with a partner.

Work alone. / Work individually / Work by yourselves.

Let's make groups of three / four / five, etc.

I'd like you to get into pairs for this activity.

Make groups of four desks / a line of desks facing each other.

Sit back to back.

Could you turn it (the volume) up/ down.

First, let's go over the homework / the explanation on page nine together.

Go on / continue with your work.

I want you to finish the exercises on page sixteen now / at home.

I want you to share a photocopy and work together.

Those of you that have finished exercise 5 can move on / go on to exercise 3.

We can't hear it from here. It's too loud.
